

# **March Legislative Update**

PROFS, the Public Representation Organization of the Faculty Senate, is a non-profit advocacy organization of UW-Madison faculty. Formed by the Faculty Senate and governed by the University Committee, PROFS provides a voice to faculty, allowing them to communicate directly with the governor, legislators, and members of Congress.

The Assembly concluded on February 22<sup>nd</sup> and the Senate plans to adjourn this month. PROFS was very busy this session working on legislation that impacts the university and faculty:

### Signed into law:

- AB 370/SB 367, legislation that guarantees admission to UW and the technical colleges and requires high schools to produce class rankings
- AB 916/SB 894, legislation that provides \$7.5 million in funding for BioForward, Inc.

#### Waiting Governor's signature or veto:

- AB 140/SB 161, legislation that would shift responsibility for negotiating the Wisconsin-Minnesota reciprocity
  agreement from the Higher Education Aids Board to UW System and require proportional distribution of funds to
  individual universities
- <u>AB 921/SB 895</u>, legislation that would provide funding for several UW capital projects, including the UW-Madison Engineering Building and lakeshore dormitories
- AB 920/SB 896, legislation altering the Wisconsin-Minnesota reciprocity funding agreement

## May be taken up by the Senate:

- AB 19/SB 27, legislation that provides funding for spinal cord research
- AB 378/SB 377, legislation that would require transgender collegiate and intramural athletes to participate on teams that match the sex that they were assigned at birth
- <u>AB 553/SB 575</u>, legislation that would establish "certain standards" for free speech, academic freedom, and due process at UW System and Wisconsin Technical College System institutions
- <u>AB 554/SB 596</u>, legislation that would change financial aid programs that target minority students to programs that target "disadvantaged" students
- AB 1065/SB 988, legislation that would prohibit loyalty pledges

### Dead

- <u>AB 947/SB 857</u>, legislation restoring strong tenure language to state statutes
- AB 949/SB 858, legislation restoring strong shared governance language to state statutes
- <u>AB 1080/SB 892</u>, legislation requested by PROFS that would align the firearms and weapons ban on campus with K-12 and other public buildings
- <u>AB 1081/SB 983</u>, legislation requested by PROFS that would allow UW institutions to begin classes on September 1 like public K-12 schools, rather than after September 1 (current law)

### **Redistricting and Elections**

Last month, Governor Tony Evers <u>signed</u> legislation that adopted his proposed legislative district maps. Republicans opted to approve those maps to avoid having the State Supreme Court draw the lines. As a result of gerrymandering, Republicans have held large legislative majorities despite the state being evenly split between political parties. The new lines have created more competitive districts, giving Democrats a chance to win a majority in the Assembly where all seats are up for election in November. Only half the Senate is up for re-election, so a new Democratic majority is unlikely.
